

As students at Mt. Olive Christian School, you are representing Christ to the world. Scripture tells us to do everything decently, in order, and to the best of our ability. With these ideas in mind, here are the guidelines we will follow:

- Students can wear short and long sleeve MOCS tees every day of the week—these should feature the MOCS logo somewhere on the garment. Students should not apply iron-on MOCS logos to pop-culture t-shirts.
- ACEL-themed gear like award tees may be worn every day of the week.
- Students can wear any collared or button-up shirt throughout the week, but should avoid large logos or brand lettering.
- Young ladies can wear dresses, skirts, and business-casual outfits during the week.
- Students can wear jeans, navy or black slacks, or khakis. Students can wear jeans, navy or black walking shorts, or khaki shorts.
- Young men can have neatly trimmed facial hair.
- Young men will be able to have hair that is a longer than their collar but all hair must be kept clean and washed. Hair will not be permitted to be in students' eyes.
- Young ladies are welcome to add some color to their hair or tasteful accents.
- ***Shorts and skirts should reach to no more than two inches above the top of the knee on both young ladies and young men.***
- Mesh shirts, tank tops, muscle shirts, see-through clothing, midriff tops and tight clothing are not appropriate school attire.
- Hoodies, hooded jackets, hats, leggings, athletic shorts, joggers, jeans with purposeful holes, and sweatpants that cinch at the ankle are not appropriate classroom attire.

CHAPEL ATTIRE-chapel is every Wednesday, and students are expected to wear khaki pants (walking shorts may be worn especially in hot weather) and a white shirt. Girls may also wear khaki skirts or jumpers with white shirts.

FRIDAY ATTIRE-students may wear Christian tees, patriotic tees, or Christian band tees on Fridays. It must be clear that the tee is meant to be Christian or patriotic. If whether or not it qualifies is “questionable,” assume it’s not appropriate for school wear. Rule of thumb: if you have to explain or justify it, leave it at home.

FOOTWEAR-Must be appropriate and absolutely no flip flops or flip flop style footwear at any time. This rule is for your child/children’s protection so that they do not fall should someone step on the back of a flip flop or they catch them on the stairs, etc.

We will honor the Lord in our dress and appearance. Clothes and hair styles should be neat and clean or students will be required to change into something appropriate or trim their hair.
